

Dev Anand Teelucksingh

Dev Anand Teelucksingh graduated from the University of the West Indies with an honors degree in Electrical and Computer Engineering. He has been working for the engineering firm Engineering Consultants since 1995.

He is a founding member of the Trinidad and Tobago Computer Society (TTCS ; <https://tcs.tt/>) in 1997 which became a non-profit organization in 2004 under his direction. Dev Anand is a lead drafter of many of the Computer Society's comments on ICT related laws and policies in Trinidad and Tobago (<https://www.tcs.tt/category/ict-policies/>) submitted to relevant Government bodies for nearly twenty years. He is also the lead developer of the TTCS OSSWIN (<https://www.tcs.tt/osswin>), a collection of Free and Open Source Software for Windows.

The Trinidad and Tobago Computer Society became a member of the ICANN At-Large Community, which represents the interests of Internet end users in ICANN's policies in 2006. He served as the Latin American and Caribbean Regional At-Large Organization (LACRALO ; <http://www.lacralo.org/>) Secretariat from 2009-2012 and served on the 15 member ICANN At-Large Advisory Committee (ALAC) from 2014 - 2016, including serving on the ALAC Leadership Team in 2016. He has chaired several At-Large Community Working Groups and continues to participate in the ICANN At-Large Community and ICANN meetings.

He has participated in several IGFs and Caribbean IGFs including speaking at the 2012 IGF on "Opportunities in the Caribbean for new gTLDs".

Dev Anand, along with other stakeholders, founded the Trinidad & Tobago Multistakeholder Advisory Group (TTMAG) which convened the inaugural Trinidad and Tobago IGF (TTIGF) in January 2017. He served as chair-elect of the TTMAG in 2017 and as chair of the TTMAG in 2018. In 2018, he joined the National Technical Committee for Information and Communication Technology to assist and advise the Trinidad and Tobago Bureau of Standards in the formulation of National Standards related to ICT.
